During the evening we will also celebrate Bovey Tracey being recently reaccredited with Fairtrade Town status and encourage those who have not got involved with Fairtrade to consider doing so and meet some of those who are already supporting it. You are invited to come along to the Town Hall to hear Nicholas's talk and sample some Fairtrade products.

This year's Fairtrade theme is the 'Big Swap'. The idea is to encourage local residents to join the 'Big Swap', where they'll swap their usual' stuff' for Fairtrade stuff; their usual lemons, t-shirts, or roses for Fairtrade lemons, t-shirts or roses. #### **BROW HILL PLAY AREA**



AS YOU maybe aware, your Town Council has been working hard behind the scenes for a number of years, to secure funding to provide an updated play area at Brow Hill. A number of community consultations have been held with all sections of Heathfield, particularly with the young people, to determine the type of new equipment to be included in this exciting project.

It may feel that there have just been a lot of promises, but no action over the past two years. It has also been noted by the Town Council, the comments of some residents that the Town Council does not do anything for the Heathfield

However, the Town Council is now able to announce that following a detailed tendering process carried out by Teignbridge District Council (TDC), a design has been selected and work to install the new equipment and enhance Brow Hill play area is due to start this March and the new play area, weather permitting, is due to be open in early May.

The design includes many of the types of equipment requested by the young people, which can be accommodated safely on this restricted site. Importantly, in addition to new swings, a seating area, new equipment for the Under 8's, the play area will contain a MUGA for the safe playing of ball games. The site will be secured in order to keep the area 'dog free', a complaint that occurs with the current play area.

The total cost for the project is in the region of £100,000. TDC has provided £33,000. The remaining £67,000 has been secured from various sources by your Town Council, including a direct contribution of £50,000. A great number of people, in addition to the Town Council, have been involved in delivering this exciting project. The Town Council would like to say 'thank you' to all those individuals and organisations that have made this project possible, which will hopefully provide years of fun and exercise for the young people of Heathfield.

Bovey Tracey Town Council would like to thank the many businesses and organisations in Bovey Tracey for financially supporting the 2009 Christmas Lights in Bovey Tracey.

Thanks also go to Mark Baker for again providing a wonderful Christmas Tree for Union Square.

#### 2010 PRECEPT

\*District Councillor

**AFTER CAREFUL** consideration, Bovey Tracey Town Council has set its precept for the next twelve months starting on 1<sup>st</sup> April. The precept is the amount of money required by the Town Council to undertake its various services on behalf of residents.

These include the management of Mill Marsh Park, the Town Hall, the Cemetery, the Recreation Ground, Allotments, play areas and other open spaces in the Parish along with contributions to the summer floral displays, Christmas lights and grants to local organisations. Last years precept was £148,855. The Town Council is able to announce it has been able to keep this year's precept at £148,855, there fore no direct increase. This relates to an annual total charge of approximately £50.39 per year for a Band D property.

The decision to retain the precept at the same level relates to the need to again raise an additional income for specific projects in Bovey Tracey and Heathfield planned for the next 12 months. Due to the continuing lack of support from Devon Youth Services in supporting the work with young people throughout the Parish, as a positive move £15,000 has again been allocated towards supporting the work of Bovey Tracey Youth Action with young people in Heathfield and Bovey.

## Beating of the Parish Bounds - Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> & Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> May



One of Bovey Tracey's most ancient - and most curious traditions - involves parading around the parish boundary and bumping boys on their heads at special marker points along the route. The last Beating of the Parish Bounds took place in May 2002. The custom of 'Beating the Bounds' was once found in almost every English parish. In an age when few could read, and before accurate maps were available, the annual ceremony

was the most effective way to maintain awareness of the limits of the parish and pass on this knowledge to succeeding generations. Come and join us in Charter Year as we again undertake 'Beating the Bounds' of the parish over the first weekend in May. We will probably not use young boys to bump the boundary stones on this occasion.
