The current library building will close its doors to the public at 4 pm on Thursday 29th October which will give the library team plenty of time to pack up and get sorted ahead of opening in the Riverside Community Centre on

Thursday 12th November at 10am. Customers will be given a longer loan period to cover them through the closure so no need to worry about fines during that period.



Dog Controls

Teignbridge District Council have introduced a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) aimed at reducing irresponsible dog ownership and making Teignbridge an even cleaner and greener place.

You can be fined if your dog is out of control in public or you do not pick up after it.

If you ignore a PSPO you can be fined:

- £100 on the spot (a fixed penalty notice)
- up to £1,000 if it goes to court



A reminder of the rules

- Pick up after your dog in public places
- Keep your dog out of areas signed as dog exclusion areas (for example, children's play parks)
- Keep your dog on a lead in certain areas
- Keep your dog on a lead when walking next to a road, on footpaths next to the road or on cycle-paths
- Where a dog is being a nuisance or annoying to people or other animals, you must put your dog on a lead if asked to do so by a council officer or police officer
- Limit the number of dogs you have with you to a maximum of six (this applies to professional dog walkers too)
- You must carry sufficient dog poo bags
