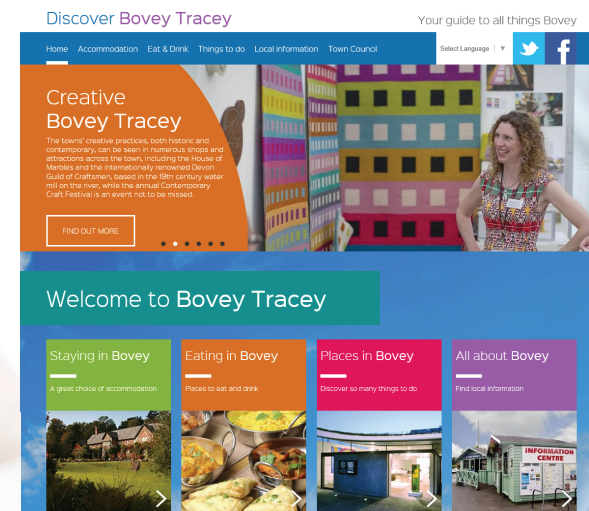

## Town Hall and Community Hub Building – Update

In January 2016, contracts were finally exchanged on a 999 year leasehold arrangement of the Town Hall with Dartmoor Whisky Distillery Ltd. The Town Council will continue to occupy the ground floor offices and Council Chamber etc for a period of up to 5-years whilst plans progress on the new Community Hub Building. The Planning Authority (Teignbridge District Council) has recently approved the application for a change of use and Listed Building Consent, which gives the project the green light for work to start.

The Town Council has been successful in being awarded a grant for funding to help as a catalyst to progress the development of the Community Hub Building on the Old Thatched Inn site. A Steering Group has formed, involving Town Councillors, Devon Communities Together and Village SOS to progress the development of a Funding Strategy, Business Plan and Consultation Strategy.
