Heathfield Update

PLANS ARE well in hand for improvements to the Brow Hill play area at Heathfield. Bovey Tracey Town Council and Teignbridge District Council are working together on this £100,000

Following the consultation events in Heathfield during February, the Town and District Councils, from requests put forward by the young people of Heathfield, now have a clear idea of what type of equipment is needed in this area to provide a safer place to meet and play for young people.

Meetings will be taking place over the next three months to finalise the layout of the site for play equipment and landscaping. There will also be a tendering process to select an appropriate and suitably qualified company specialising in the supply and installation of play equipment to bring these plans to reality for residents of Heathfiled.

The Town Council would also like to announce that after negotiations with Devon County Council and St Catherine's School, the Town Council will now be responsible for managing and maintaining the playing field opposite the old St Catherine's School. The Town Council's main priorities in the short term are to carry out long overdue maintenance work on the site in order to provide an open space for local residents to use

The Devon County Council and European Parliament elections will be taking place on Thursday 4th June. Elections of every type are at the very heart of democracy in action; regardless of whether or not the current system is the one which best serves our needs. This year's Devon County Council election has a particular significance as it could be the last time we as residents of Bovey Tracey get to vote for and select our County Councillor in the way we have become used to. The Boundary Committee will make its decision on the unitary Devon proposals in July.

With the election due on 4th June, it provides a timely reminder that everything we come into contact with on a daily basis affects how we feel and what we do. Voting in the County and European elections takes so little

time, but will have a daily impact on you and your family lives for the next four years and beyond. If you leave voting to others your opinions and wishes will

not be heard and simply by voting for a candidate you feel will reflect your view sends a clear message of your opinion to the decision makers.

It is said 'people get the local council they deserve'. Do you know who in your community is standing for election for Devon County Council or the European Parliament and what they hope to achieve?

County Councillors in particular live side by side with you in your community where they are easily contacted and directly answerable to the community every time they walk out of their front doors. They raise money primarily through your council tax to administer their decisions at County level and you need to be sure that you have voted for the right people to look after your community.
